## Congratulations on your decision to be a part of the Golden Pride Band!

Being in band at Cleburne High School will be one of the most rewarding experiences you will enjoy over the next four years. It is arguably the hardest-working and most spirited organization at CHS. Year after year, band students choose to continue in band because they have developed a strong sense of belonging in a family environment.

High school band is most notably different than middle school band because of marching band. Band students at CHS enjoy the fact that we take a prepare-then-perform mentality. In middle school, you are accustomed to preparing for weeks on end for a single performance. However, at high school, we perform on a weekly basis during marching band season, and the students love it because of the energy and excitement that comes with marching the show in front of a crowd of $\mathbf{5 , 0 0 0}$ people in a stadium on a Friday night. You will quickly come to realize that there is no greater experience.

In band at CHS, the physical demands of being a performer are high. Through marching band, students will develop a certain level of physical fitness. Marching band is widely considered the Sport of the Arts - band students earn PE credit through participation. We exercise on a daily basis throughout marching season (jumping jacks, planks, pushups, crunches, burpees, running, etc.). We must challenge each other to be stronger both physically and mentally so that we are prepared for the performance demands of the show.

In addition, we must challenge ourselves to develop a greater level of musical "fitness". In order to do this, we strongly encourage our students enroll in the music enrichment program and participate in our masterclass program throughout the school year and summer. The one-on-one time you will spend with a private instructor is much like the time you would spend with a personal trainer to improve your physical health and fitness. The stronger you are musically, the better you perform as a member of the band.

You will find that, with marching band, there are a number of skills and items that you will need for band that might seem more like what you might need for athletics - and you would be right! It's physically challenging and the experience of performing is one you'll remember for the rest of your life. The summer band experience can be tough, but students come back every year because they love the way that performing as a member of a unique and dynamic team makes them feel - especially after investing so much time and energy. We are sure that you will feel the same.

Band is a busy activity - there are before and after-school rehearsals and sectionals year-round. That said, if you have interests in other areas (athletics, clubs, organizations), we welcome and encourage you to pursue all interests. Students who get involved and stay involved succeed at a higher rate and achieve more than students who do not. Many of the most successful band students are also involved in other activities, such as AP classes, CTE, Ag, athletics, numerous clubs and student organizations, church groups, etc. No student at CHS will be made to choose one activity over the other - being a part of the CHS community is important, and your contributions are valued.

## UIL MANDATED PRE-PARTICIPATION PHYSICAL EXAM AND MEDICAL HISTORY

## ROOKIE MARCHING MINI-CAMP

This camp is for ALL new band members who play a woodwind or brass instrument. It is a fundamentals-based camp in which students will learn the basics of marching and playing in preparation for the 2021 school year. We will be active and outdoors during the morning. Wear light colored athletic clothing and a pair of athletic shoes with good cushioning that lace-up and tie. Tuesday and Wednesday, June 1-2 from 8:00am - 4:00pm (CHS Practice Field and Band Hall)

## DRUMLINE MINI-CAMP

This camp is for all students assigned to perform in the front ensemble and battery percussion sections. Students will learn the fundamentals of marching, continue learning the music fundamentals packet, and begin learning the contest marching show music. Tuesday and Wednesday, June 1-2 from 8:00am - 4:00pm (CHS Practice Field and Band Hall)

## COLOR GUARD FUNDAMENTALS CAMP

This camp is for the 2021 Golden Pride Color Guard. It is a fundamentals-based camp in which students will learn the basics of dance, choreography, silks, rifles, and sabers. We will be active so please wear comfortable athletic clothing.

This is the official start to the competitive marching band season. All woodwind, brass, percussion, and color guard members will learn, review, and refine all fundamentals related to high school band and color guard, finish learning the stand tunes, and begin learning to march and play the 2021 contest marching show. ALL members of the band are expected to attend every camp event. Starts Wednesday, July 28; Runs weekdays through August 17 from 8:00am - 5:00pm plus Saturday, August 7 and 14 from 8:00-11:00am

NOTICE: All absences, including family vacations, church retreats, summer camps, or similar events, should be avoided during Summer Band Camp and After-School Rehearsals. The band staff will finalize student assignments to Varsity and Junior Varsity marching positions during this camp in order to begin learning the contest marching show. Absences will influence those decisions.

## AFTER-SCHOOL REHEARSAL SCHEDULE

The 2021 school year begins on Wednesday, August 18. After-school rehearsals start on Thursday, August 19. The band rehearses after school every Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 4:15-6:45pm.

## 2021 GOLDEN PRIDE TAILGATE PERFORMANCE

The tailgate preview performance is the first official performance of the 2021 marching season and school year. During the performance, the students will show off the marching fundamentals and music they have been working on throughout the summer.
