Annual Title I Parent Meeting

The Requirement: Section 1116 (c)

All schools receiving Title I, Part A funds are required to convene an annual Title I, Part A parent meeting

- oto inform parents and families of their school's participation
- oto explain the requirements of the Title I, Part A program
- oto explain the right of parents to be involved



Title I Part A Program

Provides supplemental funding to schools

Funding should be used too acquire additional resources

Resources should be used to improve the overall quality of education

To ensure ALL students and families have opportunities to meet challenging state assessment standards

Eligibility Section 1114 (a)(1)(A) & (B)

 Not less than 40% of the children in the school attendance area are eligible for free/reduced lunch program

Identification, Section 1114 (a)(B)(2)

- When a school is eligible to operate a school-wide program, the school is NOT required to identify...
 - Particular children as eligible to participate in additional programs
 - Individual services as supplemental but open to all students

Program Requirements

- Conduct Comprehensive Needs Assessment
- Convene a Campus Site Base Committee
- Develop a Campus Improvement Plan

Campus Improvement Plan

Developed and approved by Campus Site Base Committee

Topics include:

- High-quality student academic assessments
- Supplemental services to assist struggling students
- Coordination and integration of federal funds and programs
- Strategies to implement effective parent and family engagement
- Title I, Part A parents have the right to be involved in the development of this plan

Teacher Qualifications, Section 1112 (e)

All teachers must meet state certification requirements.

Parents have the right to request information regarding the qualifications of their child's teacher.

Parents should make this request in writing to the campus principal.

Instructional Paraprofessionals must meet federal certification requirements.

Parents Right-to-Know

Schools are required to notify parents that the student has been assigned, or has been taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who does not meet applicable State certification requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned, Section 1112 (e) (1) (B)

Parental Involvement -1% Set Aside

Parents are encouraged to be involved in the school's programs

- Specific opportunities for their participation:
 - Volunteer in child's classroom,
 - Observe classroom activities,
 - Participate in decisions relating to the education of their children,
 - Assist in the review and revision of policy, compact, and Title I plan,
 - Serve on Parent Advisory Board, Campus Site Base Committee, etc.

Parent and Family Engagement Policy
